

EMPOWER

Recently, in reading Romans in The Passion Translation, I came across these words in Romans 15:2, "Our goal must be to empower others to do what is right and good for them, and to bring them into spiritual maturity." This expansion of the NIV reading, ² "Each of us should please our neighbors for their good, to build them up" drew my attention to this verse in a new and more focused way. The Spirit made me pause at that phrase and consider how that is the essential work of Christian discipleship—empower others to do what is right and good for them and bring them into spiritual maturity.

I like the word *empower* because it suggests that we should get actively engaged in the lives of others. Of course, we wish everyone would specialize in doing what is right and good; but are there ways that we can contribute to the process? What could you do to enable another person to do the right thing?

Jesus gave us a good model to follow with his own disciples.

First, he modeled for them the things he wanted them to do. He lived the life before them that he wanted them to live. He loved, he healed, he preached, he taught, he gave of himself, he prayed, he sacrificed, he served, and they watched. The normal pattern of education in the centuries around the time in which Jesus was here was modeled on this sort of immersive experience. Students learned by being with their teachers with the goal of patterning their lives after their teachers.

Second, he watched. After Jesus taught, he watched. He gave his disciples assignments and he watched how they performed those tasks. "You feed them," or "go and prepare the room" or, "cast the net on the other side of the boat" or, no doubt, dozens of other tasks that Jesus ask his disciples to perform. He watched them and discussed what they were doing so that they could be empowered toward doing what was right and good for them.

Third, he sent them out. Normally, he sent them out in pairs or small groups with specific commands to do the things that they had seen him doing—preach, heal, pray, serve, etc. Then they came back and reported all that God had done through them. In this way they were growing toward spiritual maturity. In the process, Jesus continued to coach and encourage them as they were refined and became more confident in their growth.

Finally, he went away and gave them the command to find others and begin the process with them: "Go and make disciples of all nations." As Paul told the Romans, the process of replicating ourselves should never end. We must always be looking for opportunities to invest our lives in others with the "goal to be to empower others to do what is right and good for them, and to bring them into spiritual maturity."

Perhaps, if we focused on this one goal better, we would make a better world for ourselves to live in. I think, maybe we could simplify all the laws, codes, rules, and commands, if we could get everyone focused on this one goal. Maybe I'm dreaming, but perhaps you would be willing to take up Paul's goal and Jesus' model and start investing your life in ways that will make a difference in the world that you will leave behind........... Just a thought.



In March 2022, two of the leaders received their local licenses; in 2023, these pastors received their district licenses. Passion supports the ongoing education of its youth, believing it is important to the holistic development of youth, equipping them, and mobilizing them with a heart for missions.
