

Situation Normal

I mentioned to the District Assembly that I am reading through the Bible again using the NRSV translation as my "new voice" this year. I have found it to be a refreshing practice to read the Bible through in a different translation from time to time because it forces me to hear it in a new way. It becomes a fresh voice to me.

I also talked to you at District Assembly about "digging a new well" this year. I challenged you to find a new expression of ministry to your community in hopes that your new well would be your Rehoboth—your place of renewed fruitfulness and peace.

It was about the time of District Assembly that my personal devotions landed me in the very familiar story of the exodus of the Israelites from Egypt. The reader is likely to be familiar with many of the details from the plagues, to the Passover, to the parting of the sea. It is difficult to know how long it is from the time Moses first encountered Pharoah to the parting of the sea. Scholars disagree on the amount of time that may have passed for the unfolding of all the plagues. However, it is not until we get to the other side of the sea that we see an interesting comment made by whoever was recording what was happening, "³¹ Israel saw the great work that the LORD did against the Egyptians. So the people feared the LORD and believed in the LORD and in his servant Moses." (Ex.14:31).

Here, in this small sidenote, the Holy Spirit seemed to say to me, "That is how it normally works. People *see* the work of the Lord, which causes them to *fear* the Lord (respect, trust, or come under convection), resulting in their *believing* (coming to faith) in the Lord, and in his servants (trusting in the people of God).

Think about this pattern as it applies to your church. If we want people to come to faith in us and in God, we have to show them something first. They must see God working *before* they will come to have faith in him and in us.

How are people who have not met God yet going come to believe in him and in his people? Do you remember the school project we used to do called, "Show and tell?" This method is God's method. He shows himself at work and we give witness to the fact that what people just encountered was God.

It seems to me that God revels himself in two primary ways. One way he reveals himself is through the work of his church. As we serve our neighbors through works of love and compassion, people *see* the Lord working through the church and come to believe in him and in his people. The other way that people will encounter the Lord is when they actually come to worship. When they *see* the Lord acting in a worship service, drawing people to him, freeing people from their sins, making himself known, breaking people's bonds of brokenness, filling the room with his presence, they *believe* in him and in his people.


Because people need to see to believe, we need to make sure that we are creating room for God to work in our midst—both when we are working outwardly *and* when we are working inwardly within the church. It does us no good to work ourselves to death trying to do the Lord's work *for* others or *for* him if he is not inhabiting it with his presence and power.

The secret to seeing God act in mighty ways in our midst goes back to verse 15 where God asks the question, ¹⁵ Then the LORD said to Moses, "Why do you cry out to me?" God's question to Moses reveals what it was that Moses was doing before God showed up. He was crying out to God.

God doesn't show up randomly. He shows up when his people cry out in desperation for his help. Let's expand the formula then. The way that God *normally* works is: his people cry out to him in desperation, then people see the work of the Lord, causing them to fear the Lord, resulting in their believing in the Lord and in their servants. Perhaps the reason we are not seeing God do wonderful things in our midst is that we haven't become desperate enough to cry out, really cry out, like our lives depended on him.






