

Rhythm

For most families, the month of September represents the return to a regular rhythm. There is a normal routine that returns to the home after the summer of camps, vacations, and activities that ran on an irregular schedule. September comes and the schedule looks more regular. Bed time and wake up time is the same most days. There is the rhythm of school, sports, homework, extra-curricular activates, weekend activities all seem to run on a more regular rhythm. Life is still crazy-busy, but it is predictable, measurable, and "normal".

I'm not sure that my life has any normal rhythm since I have entered into this particular role of ministry. Each week finds me moving from one corner of the district to another, trying to solve one problem or another. I am rarely in the same routine from week to week and hardly ever spend more than two consecutive nights in my own bed.

What anchors my life is the rhythm of worship. I can identify with the heart of David who said in Psalm 27: "I have asked one thing of the Lord it is what I desire: to dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of my life gazing on the beauty of the Lord and seeking him in his temple." (vs 4 CSV).

Even in the chaos of my normal, it is the determination to be in the house of the Lord on Sunday that has always been my anchor. It was when we had our family around us and it is now when our family is far away. That moment to stop from all the mess, the messy, and the messed up and "gaze on the beauty of the Lord" for an hour or two helps to accomplish a global reset of my heart and my life when normal is not so normal.

Worship is the fulcrum around which my heart finds its true north. Worship is the place where I find the One that my heart is searching for. Worship is the great cleansing of my over-filled life. Worship is the place where I find both the source and the summit of my heart's true desire.

Rhythm? Is there really such a thing? Perhaps you struggle to find rhythm in the day to day like many people do. However, there is One who restores rhythm and rest to your whole being. "My heart says, 'Seek his face.' Lord I will seek your face." (vs 8). In so doing so, my heart is shocked back into its true rhythm.
