Do You Love Me?

You probably immediately recognize the reference to the title of this article. It is the question that Jesus asked Peter in John chapter 21 as he met with them following the resurrection. The question came to Peter right after he had eaten a hearty breakfast that Jesus had prepared for them while they were out fishing. Nevertheless, Peter understood that Jesus was not talking about changing Peter's call to become a chef. He was calling Peter back to the core mission that he had called them to the first time he had come to them on the seaside, "Follow me and I will make you fish for people" (Mark 1:17 CSV).

Jesus clarified this missional intent one last time as he left them from the mountain saying, "Go therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe everything I have commanded you" (Matt. 28:18-20 CSV).

The way we demonstrate that we love Jesus is by continuing his mission and making disciples who know him and make more disciples.

What interests me here is that in none of these places did Jesus command us to make churches. We have churches because they are the necessary outgrowth of the disciple-making activity of Christians. However, disciple-making is not the necessary outgrowth of making churches.

Many people confess that they do not know how to go about making a disciple, so they have never tried. Yet Jesus gave us a very simple plan with his call to the first disciples.

Follow Me. Discipleship begins with an invitation into relationship. You begin making a disciple when you begin building relationships with people who do not know Jesus. That's right, discipleship begins *before* a person makes a commitment to Jesus as their Savior.

I Will Make. Discipleship is a journey of transformation. Dr. Busic has called it a *Journey of Grace*. Jesus said, "teach them to observe everything I have commanded you." More simply, he told Peter, "feed my sheep." Discipleship is a formative journey in which a person comes to know Jesus and learns to imitate Jesus.

Fish for People. The disciple-making process is reproductive. A true disciple of Jesus makes disciples of Jesus. If you are a follower of Jesus and you are not investing in other followers or potential followers of Jesus, you are a disobedient follower of Jesus. Every follower of Jesus is called to be on mission with him. His mission was to meet people where they were, invite them into a transformational relationship, and release them to do the same for the next people.

"Do you love me?" Jesus asks. There are many ways that we can demonstrate that we love Jesus. We could worship him; we could give great offerings to his work; we could attend church regularly; we could go on mission trips. All these things and more would be ways to show Jesus that we love him. However, there is only one way that Jesus asked us to demonstrate that we love him. How are we doing in that department?

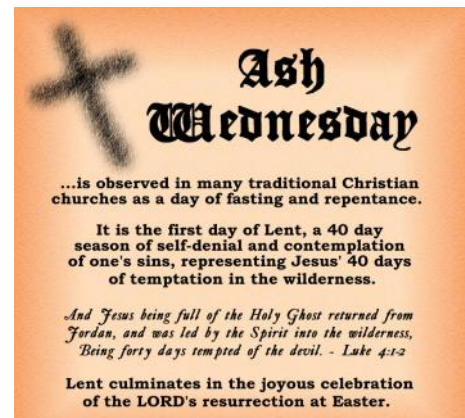
The Cyrs have four adult children and three grandchildren, and they love staying connected with churches that partner with them in prayer and support.



The purpose of this day is to raise awareness of the value of radio, promote access to information, and encourage networking among broadcasters

The Church of the Nazarene has an active broadcast ministry known as World Mission Broadcast. Thanks to new technologies, we can now communicate, share, and interact with people beyond Africa. We broadcast information related to the message of holiness through over thirty programs in multiple languages across nearly twenty FM stations in about sixteen countries. We receive regular testimonies from our listeners and currently reach around 5,000 people each month, with our audience steadily increasing as we expand into new regions. Our programs are transforming lives through the Holy Spirit.
